Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima

A Day of Prayer and Fasting for the Protection of Human Life

In response to the leak of a draft opinion in the U.S. Supreme Court case of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, some abortion advocates are calling for nationwide demonstrations, disruptions of church services, and the personal intimidation of specific Supreme Court justices. Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities invited the faithful to unite in fasting and prayer: "In the midst of current tensions, we invite Catholics around the country to join us in fasting and praying the Rosary on Friday, May 13, the Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima."

with the work he had been doing,


he rested on the seventh day from all the work he had undertaken.


